



His basement is a mortuary museum, where he has displays of how funerals use to be, when they were in your home. He also has the embalming machine that was used on President Truman.







To the left: Kate poses with her Mom, Francine Bybee. Wayne and Francine have raised two fine kids.



# Chaplain's Corner, Hughes Camp Chaplain Richard W Rudd...



In the same way that nationality, language, race, and religion can define ethnicity, so political, social, and economic ideologies and the value systems associated with them can define members of a philosophical group who, although geographically dispersed among the

general population, coalesce in the maze and recesses of the narrow, dark, twisting passages of their own psychological ghetto. To co-exist, convert, or contend with such a group, it is essential to learn how its members think. Liberals qualify for this designation.

There are three major and closely related tenets of liberalism. The first and primary tenet is undisciplined freedom of choice. To avoid the limitations and restrictions of morality and rationalism, absolute truth is rejected in favor of relativism. This rejection of truth is ultimately rejection of God, for Christ said, "I am...the truth..." (Jn. 14:6) Man is appointed the determiner of what is true and false, right and wrong. "For the time is coming when people will not endure sound teaching, but having itching ears they will accumulate for themselves teachers to suit their own likings, and will turn away from listening to the truth and wander into myths." (II Tim. 4:3) "(T)hey exchanged the truth about God for a lie..." (Rom. 1:25) The mere exercise of freedom of choice and one's own will becomes more important than the consequences of one's decisions and the facts that should guide their formation. Thus, abortion conveniently on demand, the hopelessness of euthanasia, the casual severance of marriage vows, the perverted carelessness of homosexuality, the low self-esteem and selfishness of miscegenation, all once considered abhorrent, become acceptable if the only criterion is that they result from freedom of choice. This is moral

inversion. "Woe to those who call evil good and good evil..." (Isa. 5:20)

The second tenet is indiscriminate tolerance. Again, man's will displaces the intellect, emotion displaces reason, the subjective displaces the objective. Tolerance assumes a new meaning. It is no longer the mere recognition of the existence of different views; it is the demand that all different and conflicting views be accepted as equally valid. This is unfocused eelecticism.

The third tenet is untenable diversity. It is no longer just recognition of the existence of different and opposing groups; it is the demand that they be recognized as equally worthy of existence. And again, each man decides his own values, morals, standards, and philosophy by freely acquiescing to the trends and styles of the dominant cultural group of the hour. Because trends and styles are in constant flux, reality becomes as much of an illusion as the world generated by one's computer. Man loses his sense of balance and direction, allowing himself to aimlessly drift "...like a wave of the sea is driven and tossed by the wind." (Jas. 1:6)

The application of these tenets pervade life. Academics question values, offering nothing to fill the void they create. Knowledge devolves to the manipulation and rearrangement of information, not the gathering of facts by means of balanced reason, legitimate study, and unbiased research. Wisdom, which exposes the trap of indiscriminate freedom of choice, and tradition, which upholds truth and morality, are discredited as stabilizers of life and limitations of the abuse of power. Journalists disseminate propaganda as news. Both current events and history are treated as only stories that can be altered by revisions and lying to promote an agenda. Truth and fiction, fact and fantasy are intertwined in a web of confusion. Politicians, with

Machiavillian pragmatism, say what people want to hear and make promises to be broken.

Liberalism, at the core of its essence, is contradictory, hypocritical, and self-destructive. Liberals say nothing is true and all is possible. But, if nothing is true, nothing is possible. To assert there is no truth is a statement of truth that is false. They celebrate diversity, but require adaptation, compromise, and conformity to their point of view. They boast of tolerance, but are intolerant of disagreement. They dismantle tradition, but erect precedents to prop up their ideology. They seek a new world order, but create chaos. They idolize freedom, but the resulting chaos will bring tyranny.

The English historian Arnold Toynbee studied the rise and fall of civilizations. He observed that societies disintegrated from within more often than they were defeated from without. They committed cultural suicide. He concluded western culture is in the final phase. Yet, Toynbee offered one green sprig of hope. It is possible that a society may be regenerated through a religious awakening. In America, this has occurred twice- - in 1725-'50 with Jonathan Edwards and George Whitefield and 1795-1835 in three phases ending with Charles Finney. Today's battlefields are not like Gettysburg and Vicksburg. They are in the minds and souls of men. Our most powerful weapon is not a gun, cannon, or bomb. It is "...the word of God...sharper than a two-edged sword, piecing to the division of soul and spirit...and discerning the thoughts and intentions of the heart." (Heb 4:12) Pray that the Holy Spirit will bring a third Great Awakening in America. It is our only hope.

## Monument Dedication to be held on October 30th, 1:00 PM, Richland, Missouri

The Missouri Division SCV will host a Monument Dedication the day of the Secession Day Dinner at Richland Missouri, which is near Osage Beach.

The Monument is in honor of 39 unknown Confederate Soldiers who are buried in a mass grave near Richland. The soldiers were killed in the **Battle of Monday Hollow**.

The Monument is located at Beulah Baptist Church which is located about 2.5 to 3 miles west of Richland, Missouri on 7 Highway.

Richland, Missouri is located about 30 miles southeast of Osage Beach.

Commander England would like to see at least 2 members from each Camp present.

From 44 Highway, take 7 Hwy North thru Richland to the Church. From Osage Beach, go west on 54 to the Linn Creek area and go south on 7 Hwy South 20 miles or so to the church. Linn Creek is between Camdenton and Osage Beach. When in doubt, look at Google Maps or something to find Richland, Missouri.

The Monument was paid for by the Missouri Division SCV. The funds for it were appropriated at the convention this past March. The Monument is located at the cemetery at the Church, but the mass grave is located a short distance from the monument of private property. You can see the grave from the monument.

Make a day of it! Come to the monument dedication, go back to Osage Beach and check into the hotel and enjoy a fine Secession Day Dinner!




