

## What's been happening on the Western Front..

### July 12th- Camp Meeting...

In July we had **Greg Higginbotham** as our speaker. Many Thanks to Greg for doing this for us on super short notice! We had a scheduling snafu on a speaker for July, and I literally called Greg on the morning of the meeting and he came thru for us!

Greg is always a great speaker and knows his stuff. You may remember from a prior presentation by Greg that he was present when they re-excavated Jesse James grave sometime after Jesse had been exhumed and moved to Kearney. Greg jokingly says he literally held Jesse James in his hand! Reason being is, much of Jesse including a .36bullet was left in the grave when he was first dug up. Greg held some of those remains. The bullet was probably the bullet Jesse was shot in the lung with at the end of the war, which was never extracted.

Anyway, Greg's topic this month was on Rations of Soldiers during the un civil war. He talked about the typical rations both armies were

issued, how they carried them, cooked them, etc. A couple of interesting things amongst others was that the armies quickly realized that most of the very young men soldiers had never cooked for themselves. Their moms had always done that for them. Some guys didn't have a clue what to do and would try to buddy up with those that did.

Also, hard tack, which is basically a hard cracker, also called hard bread was common in both armies. However, in 1918 the US Army issued Hard Tack to our AEF troops in Europe that was produced in the Civil War!

Something else, when these guys boiled coffee they had to use the water in their canteens. So they'd drink some of the coffee while hot then pour the left over coffee in their canteens and drink on it all day. Some guys said that was all that kept them going!
