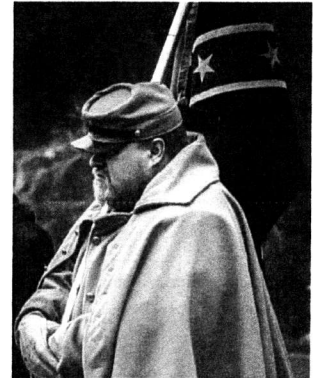

What's been happening on the Western Front

May 13 2021... Camp Meeting

In May we had one of our own Camp members as our speaker, **Steve Ferguson**. Steve's subject was **"Battle of the Little Blue River: Prelude to Westport"** This is a subject near and dear to Steve's heart, as his family farm is on part of the Battle Field along the Little Blue River. He knows that portion of the Battlefield quite well as he's scouted around on it since he was a kid.

Along the northern boundary of the Ferguson Farm is what was the Old Lexington Rd, which had a bridge crossing over the Little Blue.

This Battle was all part of Prices 1864 raid into Missouri in an attempt to retake the State and drive the Yankees out. Price fought his way up the east side of the State at Pilot Knob with the goal of taking St. Louis, Pilot Knob cost him a lot though, so he gave up St Louis and headed to Jefferson City. Finding a strong garrison there, he turned towards Independence Missouri, going thru Lexington and fighting the 2nd Battle of Lexington. Which led him to the Little Blue River near what is now 24 highway a little west of 7 highway. Union General James Blunt was retreating ahead with Price in pursuit.

Blunt set up a line of defense on the east side of the river along the Old Lexington Rd. As a strong force of Confederates approached, Blunt was

Ordered to the West side of the river. He left a rearguard to guard the bridge who had orders to burn the bridge when the Confederates got there. Blunt also covered the Fords across the river there. But Marmaduke sent men further south to another ford, and soon, the Confederates were swarming across the river. At that point the Yankees burned the bridge .

The Yankees were soon outflanked and withdrew to the Bluffs not far west of the River. At this point there were 2600 Feds with 15 cannon versus 5000 Confederates. Shelby pressed hard, and Fed Colonel Moonlight ordered his supply wagons with ammo withdrawn. The Battle raged, and by nightfall, the Yankees were on the west side of the Big Blue River, and Price was in Independence.

Steve's GG Grandfather John Hicks George and his 2 brothers, Hiram and Nathan, fought in that battle across the Ferguson Farm. Very cool.

On the Farm is a nice spring, when I look at that, I think, how many Confederates filled canteens out of that thing! One of the Ferguson Houses, sits on what's called Generals Bluff. Shelby, Marmaduke, Price etc, were able to be on the bluff and view the battlefield below them.

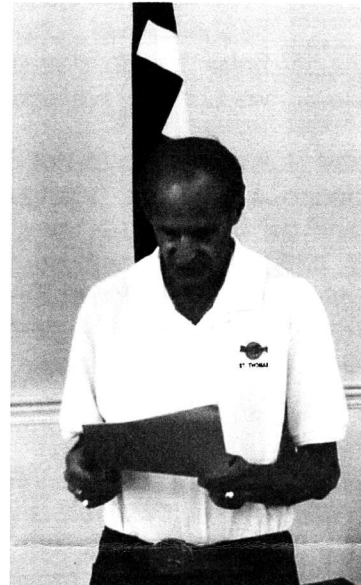

Many thanks to Steve for speaking to us about this neat history that took place on his family's land!



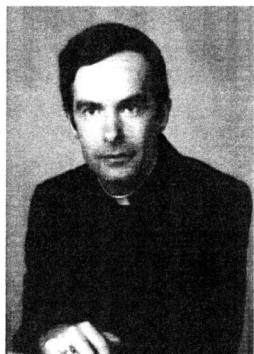

Chaplain's Corner, Hughes Camp Chaplain Richard W Rudd



In just a few weeks, we will observe July 4th and celebrate freedom. Most people value freedom, some even more than life. Patrick Henry made that choice clear during the American Revolution. Life is a sequence of choices. We have freedom regarding what we choose, not whether we

choose. There is no freedom to not choose. To neglect to choose is a choice. Yet, as valued as freedom is and as unavoidable as choices are, freedom has limits. We have no freedom of choice regarding some of the most basic things in life. We do not have the freedom to choose if or when we are born, our race, gender, native nationality and language, name, family, or economic status.

History is a record of civilizations that have advanced for a time, then grown soft or corrupt and digressed from the noble aspirations they once pursued. Old Testament history provides numerous examples. God saved Noah and his family and entrusted his descendants with repopulating the earth. (Gen. 8:17, 9:1) But men under the leadership of Nimrod, whose name means "we shall rebel," chose to disobey God and digressed. (Gen. 11:4) Consequently, God intervened to scatter man throughout the earth by developing numerous languages and three different races. The history of the nation of Israel is a continuous repetition of aspiration and digression. After the first generation entered the Promised Land with Joshua, the Israelites began to degenerate under the influence of the pagan Canaanites into the atrocities associated with Baal worship. (Jdg. 3) Israel's civilization reached a high point under David and Solomon, then succumbed to secular pagan influence. Irresponsible compromises, careless tolerance, and man's own political and economic goals replaced trust in God. (1 Kg. 11) After being freed from slavery in Babylon, the books of Ezra and Nehemiah repeat the same story. Ezra read God's law to the people and they confessed their errors and repented. Nehemiah built a physical wall of defense around Jerusalem and a spiritual wall of protection around the people.

The New Testament and 2000 years of church history also tell a similar story. Christians, having to contend with the subversive overt attacks and subtle influence of secular paganism, have struggled to retain the purity of faith of the apostolic era. Our own personal lives are microcosms of the continuation of this struggle. As Christians, we resolve to live more faithfully, yet repeatedly fall short and digress into slavery to sin. That is why confession and repentance are staples of the Christian life. (1 Jn. 1:9, 2:1)

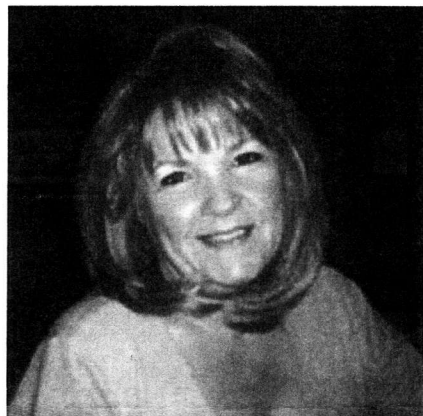
By the actions of many, freedom is won. By the actions of a few, freedom is lost. A generation of Americans now lives without the experience or memory of what it was once like to be able to walk or drive down a street without being watched by cameras, to enter government buildings and military installations without having to navigate through security guards, metal detectors, and show proper identification. They do not remember when boarding a plane was as simple as purchasing a ticket and checking in your luggage, when students did not attend schools behind locked doors, and vital personal information was not collected and stored in data banks. Why? "For the mystery of lawlessness is already at work; only He Who now restrains it will do so until He is out of the way." (II Thess. 2:7) The Restrainer is the Holy Spirit Who speaks to each man as his conscience. When He is either not present or dominant in the lives of men, their "...consciences are seared..." (I Tim. 4:2) "Now the Spirit expressly says that in latter times some will depart from the faith..." (I Tim. 4:1) there will be "...a falling away..." (II Thess. 2:3) Consequently, "...every man (will do) what (is) right in his own eyes." (Jdg. 17:6) Indiscriminate tolerance, irrational relativism, and raging chaos will result in the loss of freedom.

Petersen is a retired U.S. Marine Corps master sergeant and a highly decorated infantry combat veteran of the Vietnam War, Operation Desert Storm, and Operation Iraqi Freedom. He is a member of the William Clarke Quantrill Society, the James-Younger Gang Association, the Sons of the American Revolution, and the Jackson County and Missouri State Historical Societies.

truth. (I Cor. 13:4-6) When man chooses to damage his relationship with God, he damages his relationship with his fellow man. After the Fall in Eden, Adam and Eve's relationship suffered accusations. (Gen. 3:12) Cain killed Abel. (Gen. 4:8) And so, the reverberations of broken relationships pass down through history to the present.

American society, well into the first half of the 20th century, was predominantly Christian in its moral standards and was based on them for its way of life and very existence. As recent as 1956, Congress designated "In God We Trust" as the national motto. Imagine Congress doing that today! Freedom is spiritual, not tangible. The Founding Fathers understood the spiritual connection between Christianity and freedom. John Adams said, "It is religion and morality alone that can establish the principles upon which freedom can securely stand." He concluded, "Our Constitution was made only for a moral and religious people. It is wholly inadequate to the government of another." Noah Webster agreed, "(T)he Christian religion...is the basis, or rather the source of all genuine freedom in government...and I am persuaded that no civil government of a republican form can exist and be durable in which the principles of that religion have not a controlling influence." Charles Carroll, signer of the Declaration of Independence, as if addressing today's Americans, said, "(W)ithout morals a republic cannot subsist...; they therefore who are decrying the Christian religion...are undermining the solid foundation of morals, the best security for the duration of free governments."
