Dan gave us details on the Battle of Lone Jack. Leading up to the Battle, there was a concerted recruiting effort going on in the area. There were various recruiting camps around Jackson County and many men we're coming in to join. These guys were all homespun, came with weapons from home. Hindman signed off on the recruiting expedition into Missouri, and Col. Jeremiah Cockrell was leading the recruiting effort.


John T Hughes had been killed shortly before at the Battle of Independence. Gideon Thompson was wounded in the Battle of Lone Jack. If was a who's who list of Confederate Leaders at the Battle to include troops led by, Upton Hayes, Sidney Jackman, Hunter, Tracy, Coffee.

Shelby was not present at the battle as he was up in the Waverly area. Quantrill was near by but not at the Battle.

Jackman wrote an account after the war of the battle. He was kind disparaging of his fellow officers at the battle! I should have made better notes, but questioned Hunter's manhood or something like that. He said Cockrell wanted to retreat from the area fearing Yankee enforcements. Jackman urged an attack at dawn and did win on that.

Dan also told us about a joint Lone Jack Historical Society and Quantrill Society effort, where on October 14th, they'll do a reenactment of a Quantrill Men Survivors reunion. Look for more to come on that!

Chaplain's Corner, Hughes Camp Chaplain Richard W Rudd



The late Flip Wilson, a hilarious comedian, when he would get into trouble in one of his skits, used to say, "The Devil made me do it." That excuse is as old as human history. When God questioned Adam about his disobedience, he replied, "The woman whom You gave to be with me, she gave me fruit of the tree..." (Gen. 3)

Eve also passed the buck, answering, "The serpent beguiled me..." Satan does not have the power to force us to sin; he cannot abrogate our God-given right of freedom of choice. What he does do is resort to the same old strategies to induce us to sin: flirtation and fascination to lure us, fear to intimidate us, and the utilization of forces in a desperate attempt to coerce us. He targets our vulnerabilities; our needs, wants, ignorance, and weaknesses. Regarding weaknesses, a man of the stature of St. Paul admitted, "I do not understand my own actions. For I do not do what I want, but I do what I hate." (Rom. 7:15) "For the desires of the flesh are against the Spirit, and the desires of the Spirit are against the flesh; for these are opposed to each other, to prevent you from doing what you would." (Gal. 5:17) Over time, the victims, situations, and bait or threats change, but Satan's methods remain the same.


Concerning allurement and charm, Satan often seeks to gain our confidence by working through those close to us. He used Eve to influence Adam, Michal to influence David (II Sam. 6:20), Job's wife to influence him (Job 2:9), and Peter to influence Christ (Matt. 6:23) Satan urges us to question the certainty, truth, and reasonableness of what we know. He asked Eve, "Did God say...?" Doubt is planted in the mind. Curiosity is stoked. It is said that a cat has nine lives, yet curiosity killed the cat.
