




Have a good Independence Day and I'll see you at the meeting next week. We have a great program lined up for you!

I realize this news might get to you after the funeral but wanted you all to be aware of it.

## **June 10th Camp Meeting:**


Our speaker last month was Jim Beckner, who gave us a great presentation on the Confederate Constitution. The CSA loved the US Constitution and adopted it and ratified it quickly. But by 1861 they had 80 years of hindsight and thought it could use a few modifications.

Here are some of the key differences, all which would have done a great deal to limit out of control Federal spending. They really ended up with a cross of the Articles of Confederation the US was originally under, and the US Constitution.

- The Presidency was limited to one six year term and couldn't run for reelection. 6 years was long enough for his ideas to work or not work, and he didn't spend the first 4 years pandering with your tax dollars to buy votes for reelection. He wouldn't have to worry about reeclection, so he could spend his time doing his job instead of campaigning.
- 2. The President was given line item veto power.
- Banned Central Government improvements. It would be up to the States to build their own roads and bridges etc. That way



tax dollars wouldn't be taken from one State to spend building a bridge to no where in another State.

- 4. Each Bill voted on by Congress could only have one item in it. That way a good bill wouldn't get 12 bad ideas attached to it, and to pass the good idea you had to pass the bad ones.
- 5. A 2/3rd vote by the Senate could get rid of Federal Judges. That would end life time appointments of bad judges.
- No deficit spending, the budget had to be balanced.

These are just some of the key differences. But like Jim says, just think if these ideas would have had a real chance of succeeding. Just think what these simple things would do to control spending. By the time the secession happened, the US Federal Government was already deep in debt. The CS guys saw that and knew the central government would need further limitations.




## Some more pictures from Higginsville...




