Message from the Commander, Jason Coffman

Veterans' monuments and historical markers are under attack all over the country. Our Veterans' sacrifice and honor must be protected.



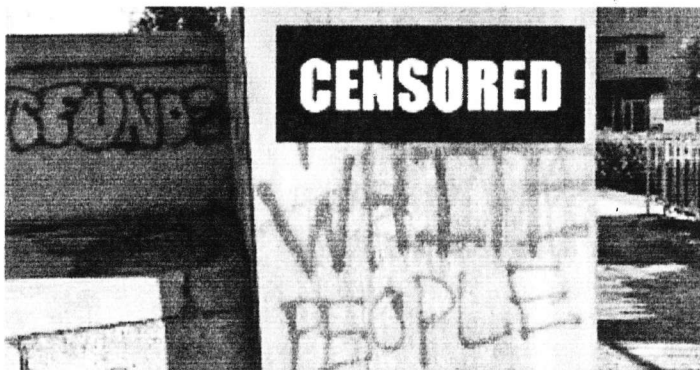

H.B.53, THE MISSOURI HERITAGE PROTECTION ACT.

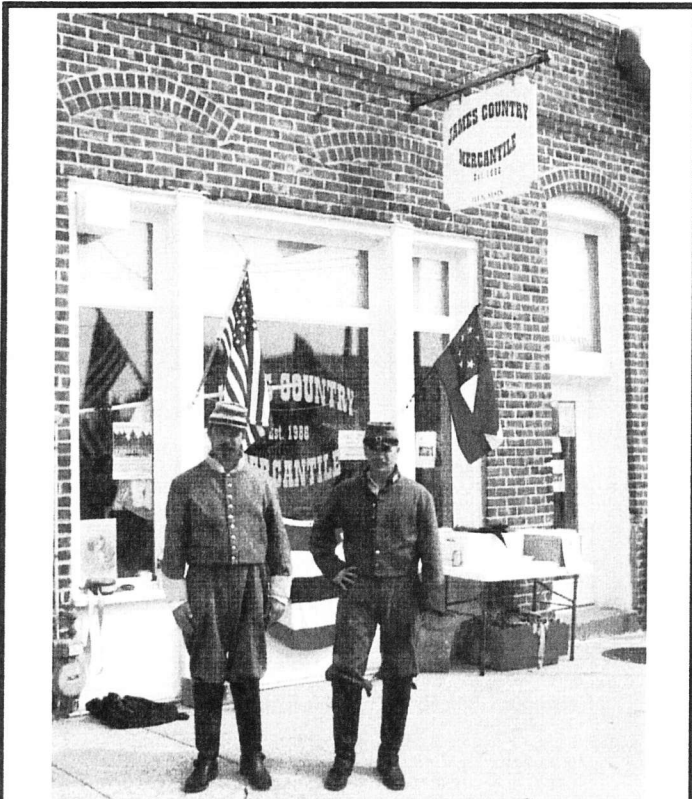
The Speaker of the House, **Representative Todd Richardson** (*phone: 573-751-4039, email: todd.richardson@house.mo.gov*) refused to assign the bill to committee. The bill never saw the light of day despite repeated urgings by the Sponsor of the bill to assign it to the Veterans Affairs Committee. The bill will be reintroduced for the 2018 General Assembly with a new bill number.

Contact Speaker of the House Todd Richardson and tell him to assign and support THE MISSOURI HERITAGE PROTECTION ACT. Call Governor Eric Greitens (*phone: 573-751-3222*) and tell him you want our Veterans' Monuments protected. Call your district State Representative and State Senator and ask/tell them to sponsor and support the bill. Be sure to tell them if you are a Veteran, spouse or relative of a Veteran!

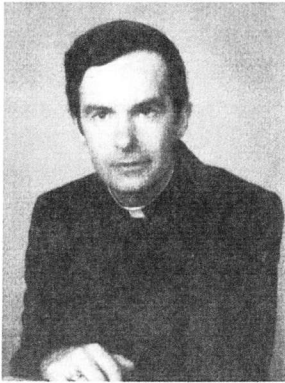

To discover the origins of the three major races of humanity, one must study the genealogies of Noah's three sons in Genesis 10. Japheth was the progenitor of those who migrated toward Europe and became the

Caucasian race. Shem was the progenitor of those who migrated throughout the Middle East and Asia, the majority of which became the Mongolian race. Ham was the progenitor of those who migrated south to Africa and became the Negro race. For the same reason that men were divided by the different languages spoken today which originated at Babel, so the division of men by different races provided the means by which "...the Lord scattered them abroad over the face of all the earth." (Gen. 11:9) Why were they scattered? After the Flood, God said, "Be fruitful and multiply, and fill the earth." (Gen. 9:1) It was man's disobedience to this command that resulted in the fiasco at Babel and the divisions of humanity.

At this point, an interesting observation might be made about Babel, located on the plain of Shinar in present-day Iraq. Under the leadership of Nimrod after the Flood, a still united mankind arrogantly asserted, "Come, let us build ourselves a city, and a tower with its top in the heavens, and let us make a name for ourselves, lest we be scattered abroad upon the face of the whole earth." (Gen. 11:4) Later, Babel became Babylon. Long after this city ceased to exist, its spirit has continued to infect the world. "It has become a dwelling place of demons...for all nations have drunk the wine of her impure passion..." (Rev. 18:2) It is credited with being the "mother of...earth's abominations." (Rev. 17:5) The Babylon effect can be witnessed in America's major cities where liberal ideology concentrates and crime rates continue to soar. The demographics of the last election demonstrated that without the electoral college urban liberals could dominate national politics. Even the roots of the ominous threat of globalism can be traced back to Babel and Nimrod. It is the same attempt to unite mankind on a worldwide scale

to rebel against God's will. Life in a metropolis, a man-made environment, prevents man from living close to the earth. He loses intimate contact with the nature God has created and ceases to learn its lessons.

A new year has dawned in America. There seems to be more reason for hope than apprehension. But as the Carpenters sang back in 1970, "We've only just begun." There has been much discussion about building a wall. The concept is nothing new. China built a 1500-mile wall in the 3rd century BC as a defense against the Huns in the north. Rome built the 74-mile Hadrian's Wall in AD136 as a barrier making the northern boundary of the empire in Britain against barbarian tribes. Berlin was divided by a wall in 1961. Israel built a wall to defend itself against Moslem terrorists. Around 500BC, Nehemiah returned to Jerusalem from the Babylonian Captivity to rebuild the walls of the city. Those walls were a key element of revival and restoration in the Jewish homeland. America is in need of revival and restoration; calculated divisiveness has caused breaches to develop in our walls which need to be repaired. Christ said, "(I)f a house is divided against itself, that house will not be able to stand." (Mk. 3:25)

As Nehemiah faced opposition from Sanballat, Tobiah, Geshem and their followers (Neh. 2:10, 4:1, 6:1), so those who seek to rebuild America face opposition. The enemy within is more dangerous than the enemy without. While the manifestations of liberalism are insanity, the origins of it are demonic. Though the enemy might momentarily appear to be vanquished, it only goes underground to regroup and reorganize to come back again like a bad disease. The last general election resulted in what in legal terminology is called a "stay," the temporary halting of the enforcement of a judgement, in this case the liberal agenda, whereby it is precluded from being executed for a period of time, or until the next election. In the meantime, while liberals have lost control of the battlefield, they will continue to engage in disruptive acts of terrorism and guerrilla warfare. "Upon your walls, O Jerusalem, I have set watchmen; all the day and all the night they shall never be absent." (Isa. 62:6) As Christians and patriotic Americans, God charges us to be watchmen on the wall, sentinels who must be tirelessly alert and ready to warn of the enemy's presence and movements. We must be faithful, enduring, and never silent because of threats, intimidation, or cowardliness. As Jefferson admonished, "Eternal vigilance is the price of liberty."

Coffman continued... In these psychotic lectures graphic sexual matter was introduced to children and they were taught that promiscuous activity was okay. In 1923, Georg Lukács met another mentally challenged Marxist nut job named Felix Weil. These two nut jobs started the Frankfurt School in Germany. Together, along with another mentally challenged nut job named Max Horkheimer, they began mixing the ideas of Sigmund Freud with those of Karl Marx, and Cultural Marxism was born. In 1933, these mentally challenged nut jobs decided to leave Europe, come to North America and bring their psychotic philosophy with them. Adolf Hitler was coming into power and Fascism and Cultural Marxism did not mix very well. In 1934 Cultural Marxism manifested itself at Columbia University. The breakdown of our

society started here with the Critical Theory. The Critical Theory criticized every pillar of Western culture, family, free market, common law, and the freedom of speech to name some. A book was co-authored by another nut job named Theodor Adorno. The book was called *The Authoritarian Personality*. The subject matter of this book was about redefining traditional American views on gender roles and sexual mores as Adorno thought they were prejudice. Adorno compared them to the traditions that led to the rise of Fascism in Europe hence why the modern day mentally challenged nut jobs call traditionalist Americans who hold on to their heritage Fascists or Nazis. The nut jobs at Columbia University went on and shifted away from economics and towards Sigmund Freud's propaganda by publishing works on psychological repression. They split American society into two main groups: the oppressors and the victims. From there, they argued that the social roles of men and women were due to gender differences defined by the "oppressors." Genders did not exist in reality but were a "social construct." Another mentally challenged nut job at the university named Herbert Marcuse published a book called *Eros and Civilization* in 1955. Marcuse argued that Western culture was inherently repressive because it gave up happiness for social progress. The book called for "polymorphous perversity," a concept dreamed up by Sigmund Freud. It put emphasis on the idea of sexual pleasure outside traditional normality. *Eros and Civilization* would become very influential in shaping the sexual revolution of the 1960s. The book questioned who would replace the working class as the new vanguards of the Marxist revolution? Marcuse believed that it would be a victim coalition of minorities, women, and homosexuals. The social movements of the 1960s took on this type of propaganda. Black power, feminism, gay rights, sexual liberation gave Marcuse an opportunity to release Cultural Marxist ideas into the mainstream. Railing against all things "establishment," The Frankfurt School's ideals caught on like wildfire across American universities. Marcuse then published a book called *Repressive Tolerance* in 1965 as the various social movements in America were in full swing. In it, he argued that tolerance of all values and ideas meant the repression of "correct" ideas. It was here that Marcuse coined the term "liberating tolerance." It called for tolerance of any

ideas coming from the left but intolerance of those from the right. One of the themes of the Frankfurt School was total intolerance for any viewpoint but its own. That is also a basic trait of today's political-correctness nut jobs. In turn, this has contributed to the undeniable breakdown of the family unit, as well as identity politics, radical feminism, and racial polarization in American society. The political establishment in America has fully embraced the ideas of the Frankfurt School and has pushed them on American society through public reeducation. The nut jobs Barack Obama and Hillary Clinton, the beacons of communism, are both disciples of another nut job Saul Alinsky, a devoted and mentally challenged Cultural Marxist.

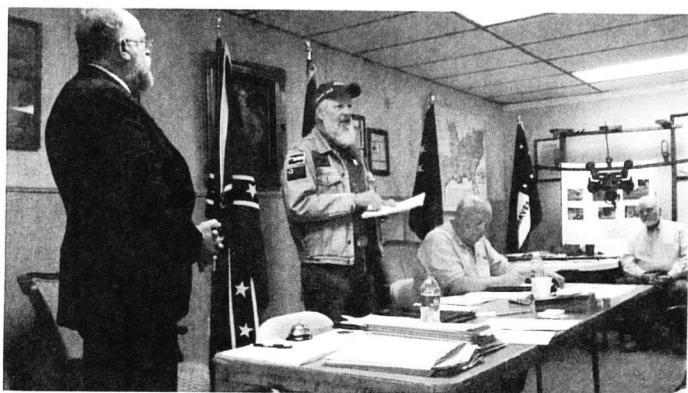


A view of the meeting at Gates Camp's very cool lodge, chock full of great displays and artifacts. They've got it going on!

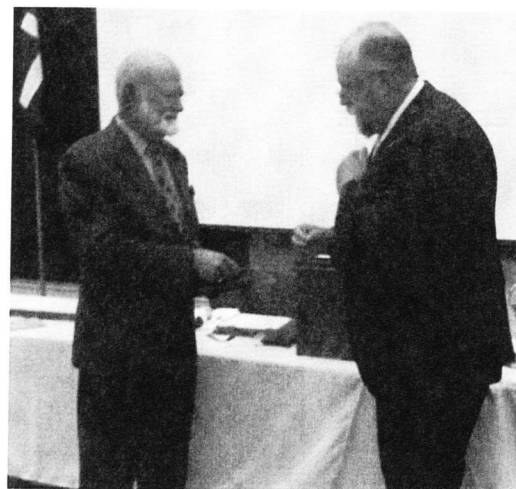

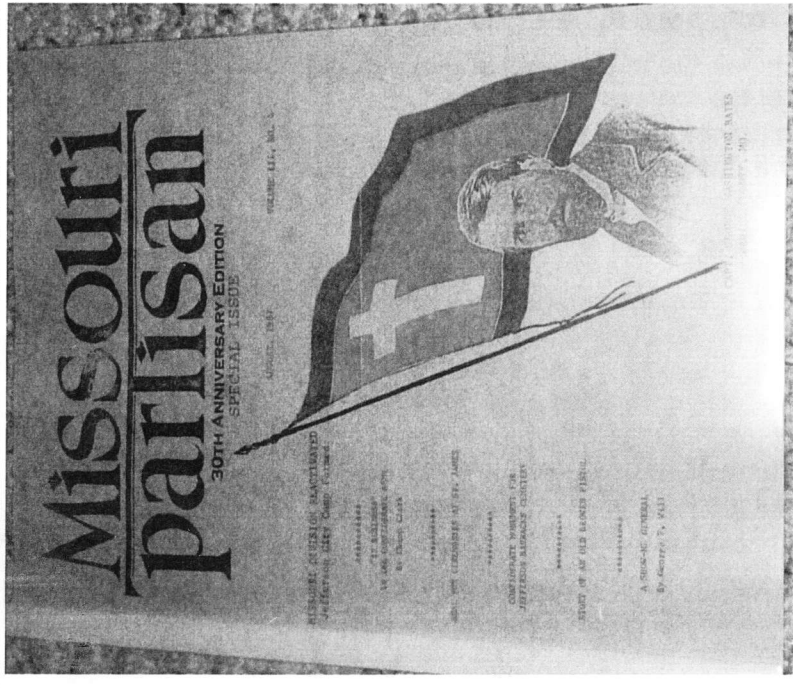
