Sophee is a recent year 2020 horse that has won races.


Claiborne Fox Jackson had a horse race track.

I hope to see many of you at our Missouri Division SCV and Missouri Society MOS&B State Reunion in Sikeston, Missouri.



Chaplain's Corner, Hughes Camp Chaplain Richard W Rudd



Yesterday, the current older generation could not imagine the world we live in today. Today, the younger generation cannot imagine the world they lived in yesterday. Not so many years ago, more Americans lived closer to the earth in small towns and rural communities that had their own unique identities and social network.

Even metropolitan areas shared some of these characteristics. Several generations of families with familiar names were rooted in a community, neighborhood, even the same house. People knew each other. Personal and family identity and reputation were important. People communicated with each other through the local newspaper, on main street or the town square, in civic organizations and parks, and neighborhood and church grapevines were more efficient than the internet will ever be. There was a rhythm to life, like a familiar song. During the week, adults worked and children attended the local school. In the evening, family members gathered at home around the dinner table. Saturdays were spent shopping and enjoying recreation. Sunday was reserved as a day of rest spent in church and with family and friends. Christian morality, shared values, history and traditions, and patriotism were transmitted to each generation, creating a civilized social order in which people exercised self-discipline, governed themselves, and looked out for each other. There was no need of locked doors on public buildings, security guards, metal detectors, and cameras.

Christ told the people of His day, "You know how to interpret the appearance of the sky (determine weather patterns), but you cannot interpret the signs of the times." (Matt. 16:3) Today, He might tell people, "You know all about athletes, movie stars, and fads, but you are unaware of the changes occurring around you." During the 1960's and again in the 1990's, the US experienced seismic cultural shifts. Like a spiraling bullet in a rifle barrel, events are transpiring with such increasing rapidity that we no longer have time to adjust to the changes they generate in our lives and the world surrounding us. Yet at the same time, these changes are as subtle as the transition from darkness to daylight. The process is analogous to Satan's temptation of Eve. (Gen. 3) He began, not

with a bold statement, but rather with a suggestive question followed by an alluring lie. The worst effects of Adam and Eve's sin were not immediate and went unnoticed.

The proliferation of big chain stores has slowly closed home-owned businesses and the development of shopping centers destroyed main street. Interstate highways and corporate jobs have moved people away from their hometowns. The most recent disruption in our patterns of life was the Wuhan virus. Technology, from computers to satellites, has revolutionized communication. Parents and local communities must now compete with cable TV, Hollywood, and the internet over the formation of their children's minds. Misinformation and provocative questions sow doubt. Docudramas mix fiction and reality. The trivial is amplified. Images have replaced words and reading has declined. The eccentric is portrayed as normal and acceptable, while inconvenient truths are criticized and mocked. Homogenizing fads have destroyed personal and regional identities to amalgamate American society. People no longer know each other and personal identity is fading into anonymity. In this election year, we witness that politics is no longer the arena in which real issues are debated, but rather a staged and scripted theatrical drama where promises are made to be broken when convenient. The Constitution is being called a "living document", reinterpreted by legislating judges to support politically correct views. The Founding Fathers and patriotism are villainized. History and traditions are no longer regarded as a record of facts. They are being edited, revised, and erased to become mere metaphoric literature to be contemporized to suit current events. Education has become indoctrination, the assimilation of useful information as opposed to the cultivation of knowledge. Christian morality and shared values are being subverted and replaced with relativism, the philosophy that there is no absolute truth. Each individual is free to construct their own imaginary reality and to determine what is true for themselves, even their gender, and what supports their agenda or provides gratification. The will replaces the intellect and emotion replaces reason. The result is Fascist nihilism characterized by confusion, chaos, and ill will among competing social divisions: liberal vs conservative, masculine vs feminine, hetro vs homosexuality, capitalism vs socialism, nationalism vs globalism, Jews and Christians vs antisemitic secularism, abortion,

eugenics, and euthanasia vs the sanctity of life. Groups view each other as egotistical, arrogant, bigoted, and racist. People can no longer govern themselves, resulting in violence and increased government policing to enforce more restrictive laws. What described the Israelites during the era of the judges describes our current dilemma. "In those days...every man did what was right in his own eyes." (Jdg. 21:25)

The lyrics of a Christian hymn say we are what we receive. This is true whether it is genetics we inherit, the food we consume, or the experiences we encounter. Fiction, situation ethics, and impulsiveness have replaced truth, morality, and reason. America has become what it has received as a result of changes in immigration quotas and undefended borders, allowing more people to import different religions, values, traditions, and political philosophies that foster divisions within the US. Consequently, people think differently and parrot popular words and phrases that are given different meanings. What we say and what other people hear, due to the proclivities of the personal point of view they subscribe to or the popular jargon of the day, might be direct opposites. For example, at election time, I like to tell people to vote right. They might interpret that as voting correctly rather than wrong, or conservative rather than liberal. Cherished freedom has become careless abandon, education is now indoctrination, propaganda passes for information, cowardly conformity satisfies the desire to belong, and reality exists in the imagination. We look without seeing, hear without listening, know without understanding, think without reasoning, and converse without communicating. This is why it has become so difficult to encourage patriotism, propagate the Gospel, transmit history, and defend Christian and Confederate monuments, all of which existed unthreatened until recently, by appealing to obvious truths and common sense. In the not too distant past, people with different viewpoints could discuss, negotiate, compromise, and find some common ground. Today, they resort to personal defamation, protracted and costly litigation, rioting in the streets, vandalism, and other grotesque acts of desperation.

Politically correct skeptics quote Pilate, "What is truth?" (Jn. 18:38) Christ answers, "I am the...truth..." (Jn. 14:6) E Pluribus Unum, the civil co-existence of diversity and unity, will never be achieved through the destruction of nationalism and the dream of globalism. "For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ." (I Cor. 12:12) The brotherhood of men and peaceful co-existence can only be realized under the fatherhood of God.

7. Booth rental fees and electrical (if applicable) must be paid at the time of registration.
8. Due to limited availability, booth space is available on a **FIRST PAID BASIS**
9. Late registrations after **APRIL 15th** will be directed to their booth location at the time of check in.
10. All booths will be clearly marked, and festival committee members will be available to assist with location.
11. Vendors **MUST** furnish their own tables, chairs, tent, etc., and all items must stay within your designated space.
12. Electrical hookups are limited and available on a first come first serve basis.
13. Vendors must supply their own adapters & extension cords for a 110 30- amp plug hookup. Extension cords must be at least 150 ft. in length. **WE CAN NOT GUARANTEE YOU A SPACE WITHIN 50-100 FT OF ELECTRICAL BOARD.** Any cords or adapters that are deemed unsafe or in despair by festival staff will **NOT** be allowed to connect to our electrical boards/outlets.
14. **NO GENERATORS ALLOWED.**
15. There is no limit on the number of Arts and Crafts booths selling like or similar items. However, we do our very best to separate like vendors when assigning booth locations.
16. Please make sure to list what items you are selling on the vendor registration form. **ALL ITEMS BEING SOLD, DISPLAYED, AND PROMOTED ARE SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL OF MUSHROOM FESTIVAL COMMITTEE.**
17. The selling of items with violent, graphic, obscene, or vulgar wording, offensive artwork, cartoons, on t-shirts or any other surfaces/items will not be allowed. As well as, selling items negatively depicting race, religion, ethnicity, and gender.
18. Weapons, knives, mace, or any other self-protection items/devices that could harm or incapacitate is not permitted. Exotic smoking equipment may not be sold or displayed.
19. All vendors will be responsible for all applicable Missouri State sales tax and county sales tax.
20. Please provide your own trash bags. Trash dumpsters will be located throughout the festival. Large dumpsters will be available in designated locations. Please collapse boxes before putting them in dumpsters to allow space.
21. **NO PETS** are allowed inside festival per a City of Richmond Ordinance.
22. Exhibitors understand they should carry their own business/personal liability insurance.
23. **ALL** vendor vehicles must be moved off the square and outside festival barricades. Vehicles will be towed if we can't identify who the vehicle belongs to.
