

What's been happening on the Western Front

Camp Meeting, November 14th...

Our last regular camp meeting was so long ago, it feels like it happened last year. Because it did. With no Hughes News being published in December, this is the first chance to tell you about the November meeting.

Rick McPherson of the Thomas J Key Camp in Lenexa KS was our speaker. Rick has served many positions in Key Camp, but is currently the editor of their Camp Newsletter, the "Telegraph Key".

Rick's subject was "Turner Ashby- right hand man of Stonewall Jackson"

Turner Ashby was a dashing fellow, and had many female friends! He was often called the Black Knight of the Confederacy. He was the Grandson of Chief Justice John Marshall. Ashby's cavalry, when first formed, was called the "Mountain Rangers" My notes aren't clear if they continued to go by that name. But he had a lot of Black horses in his Cav unit, but he rode a white horse. Because of that, it was said he was a ghostly figure out on the campaign.

Jackson recognized Turner's talent, and often assigned Ashby to perform Rear Guard during withdrawals etc. Ashby also raised a lot of cain in the Shenandoah Valley and tied up lots of Yankee Troops there chasing him around.

Turners brother was murdered by the Yankees, who shot him 13 times and bayoneted him. This enraged Turner who went on a rampage killing many Yankees.

Jackson relied on Turner more and more. In Feb of 1862 Turner was made a full Colonel. Turner gained in popularity. Turner had 27 companies

under his command which was abnormally large. Really too large to properly manage. In one big battle (my notes missed where), Turner was everywhere, encouraging his men. His horse was shot dead from under him. Turner got to his feet to lead, and he was shot dead while yelling, "charge men, charge, for God's Sake". Turner had been appointed as Brigadier General just two weeks before. General Jackson was quite upset about the loss of Turner Ashby.

Hughes Camp Chaplain Emeritus Richard W Rudd



The Presidential inauguration is only days away. As Americans, we have experienced provocative and perilous events in our nation that have displayed political, historical, and theological parallels. In particular, the story of Joseph, Jacob's son, whose biography is recorded in Genesis, reveals interesting parallels between .

Joseph and Donald Trump.

Joseph spoke boldly and honestly to his brothers (37:5,9); Trump has spoken likewise to his fellow citizens. Joseph foresaw assuming governing authority (37:6-11); Trump envisioned pursuit of the presidency. Joseph endured enmity, not from foreigners, but from his own brothers (37:4); Trump experienced enmity from his fellow Americans. Joseph's brothers conspired to kill him (37:18); two Americans planned to kill Trump. Joseph was spared from being killed (37:21); Trump dodged the fatality of an assassin's bullet. Joseph was accused by a woman of sexual impropriety (39:14); Trump was accused of the same conduct. Joseph was imprisoned (39:20); Trump has been threatened with incarceration. Ultimately, Joseph was vindicated and made ruler of Egypt, the major world power of his time (41:39-41); Trump has been vindicated by being re-elected president of the US, winning a majority of both electoral and popular votes. The reason for Joseph's rise to political power was to lead the people through a sever crisis which was a famine (41:29-31; 45:5-8); the reason for Trump's re-election and the intervening interval between his two terms, which has occurred only once before with Cleveland, has yet to be revealed. The split terms might be to place Trump, like Joseph, in the right place at the right time. The most reliable poll of where the American people stand is a general election. This last election resulted in roughly 68 million vs 72 million votes, which is only a 4 million difference. In spite of the unexpected margin of Trump's victory, the election was a decisive barometer of America's polarization and division. The reason for Trump's re-election might be twofold. Domestically, America needs to be reoriented in the right direction and reunited. Internationally, recent events and escalating tension in the Middle East are portents of the prophesied war of Ezekiel 38 & 39.

While this war is inevitable, will Trump be able to delay its occurrence? Only time will tell.
